

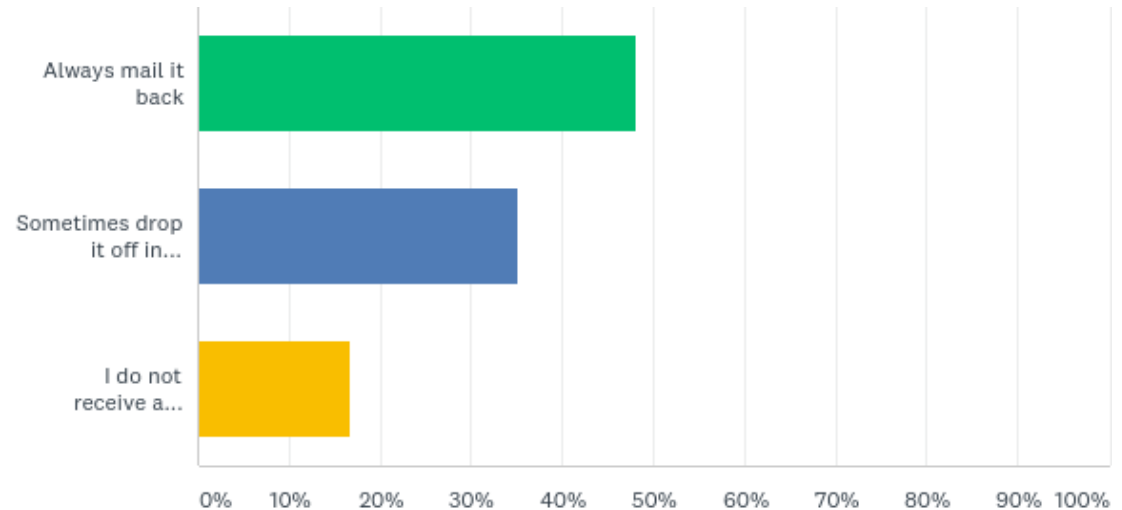

# Q2: If you receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot do you:

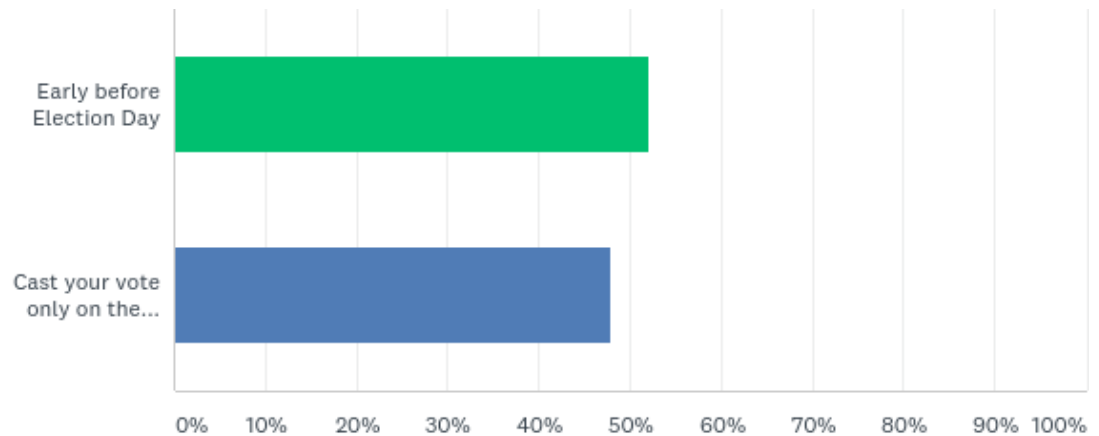
Answered: 1,635 Skipped: 37

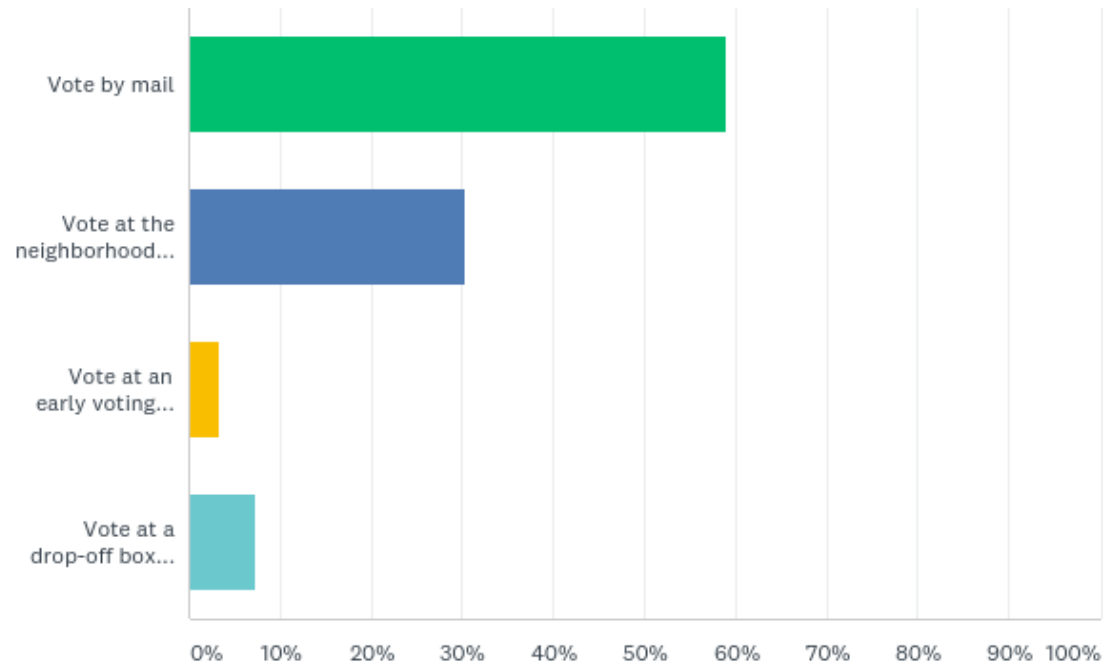

# Q4: How do you currently cast your ballot:

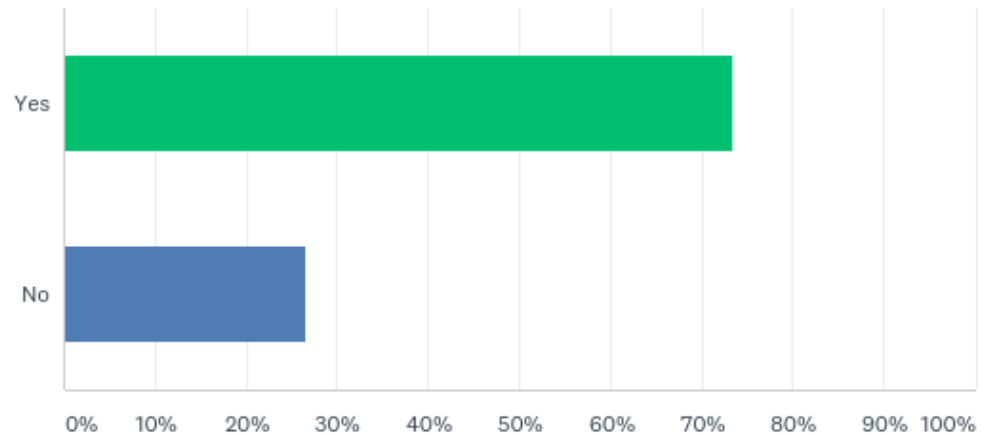

Q5: Would you be in favor of replacing the neighborhood polling place if doing so meant you could vote at any center that would be open more days and longer hours:

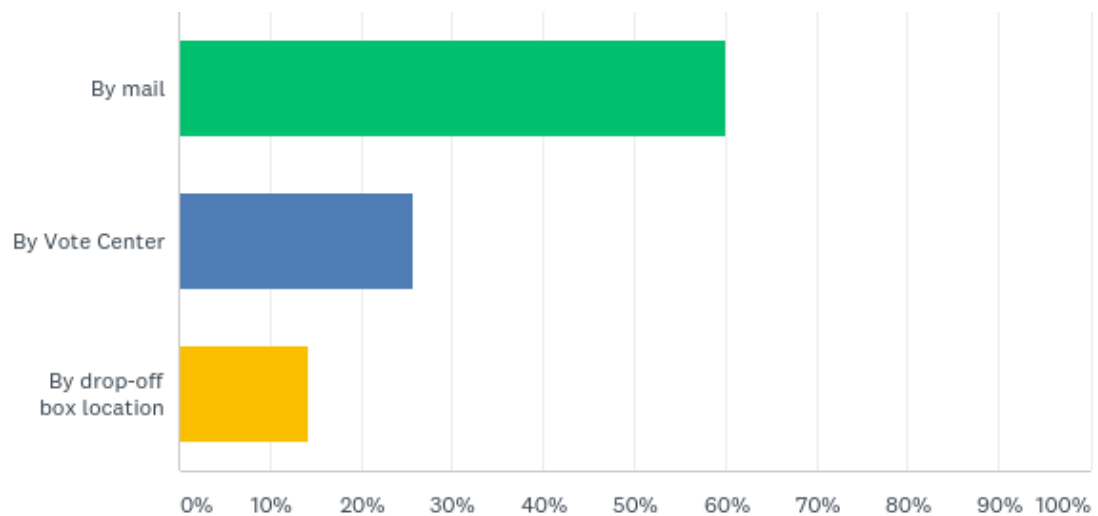

# Q6: If Santa Clara County moves to vote centers, would you be more likely to vote:

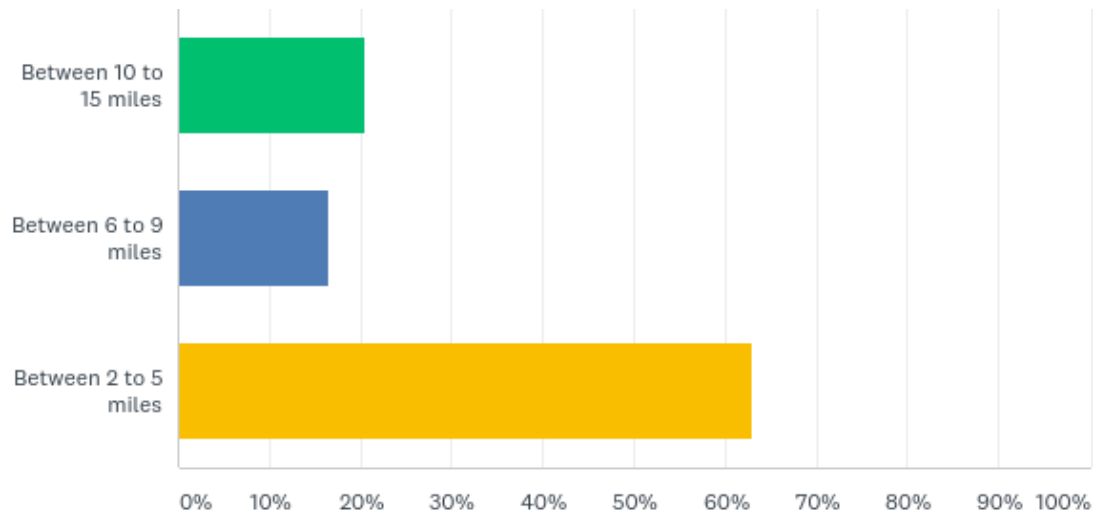

# Q7: If you were to vote at a location outside of your neighborhood what is the maximum distance you would travel:

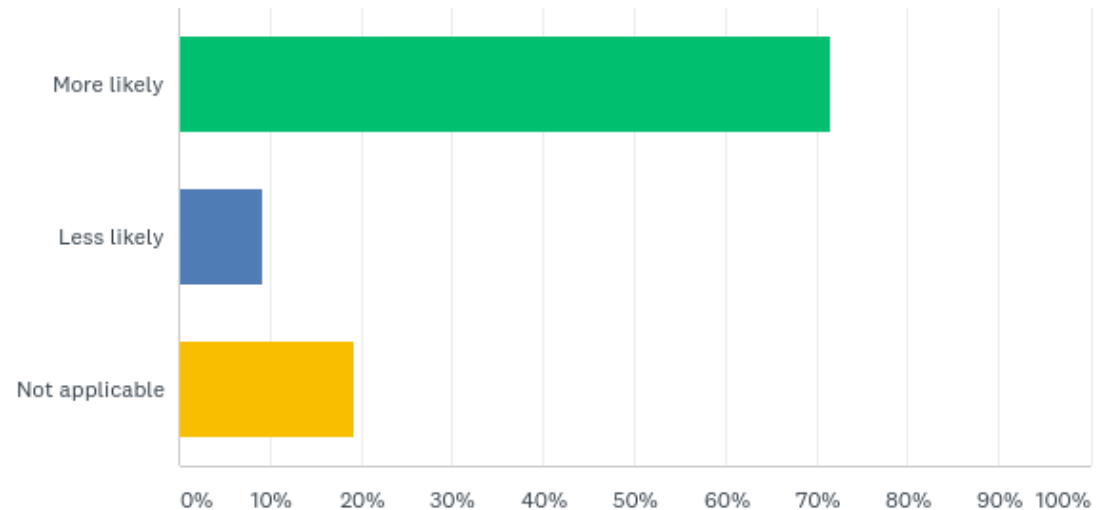

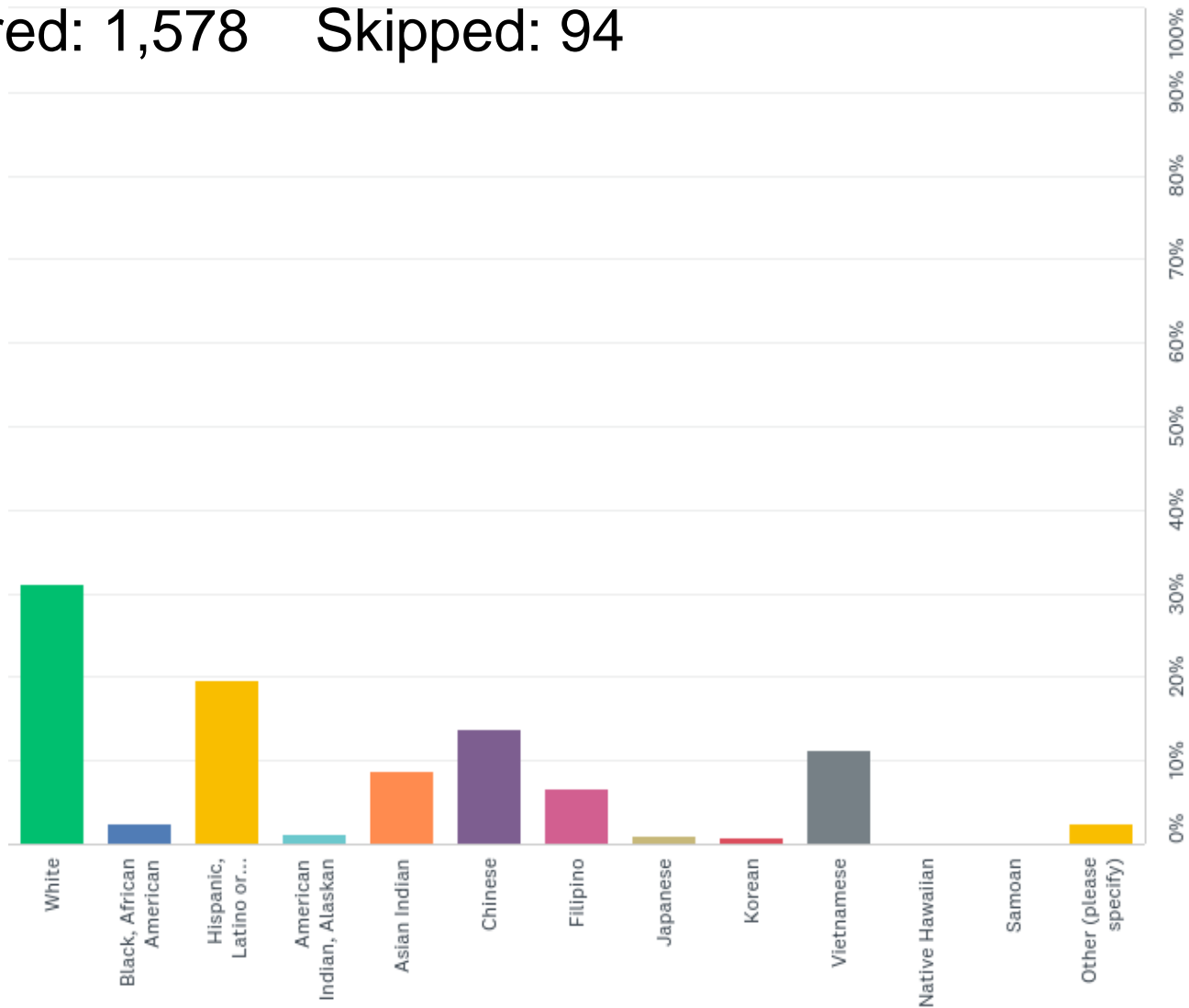

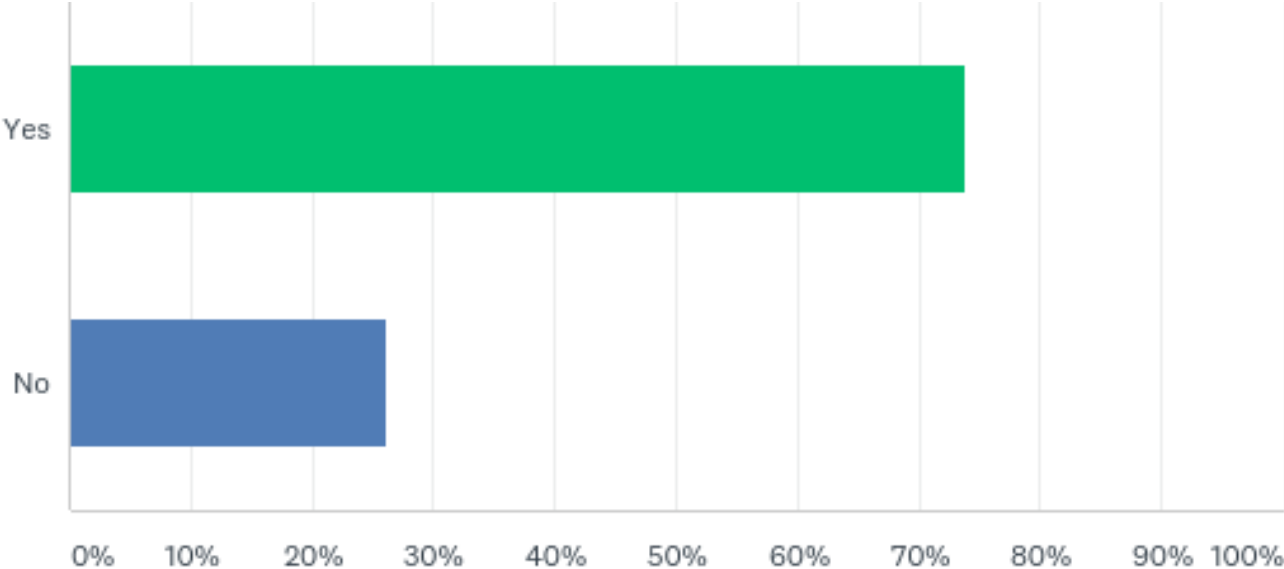

District 3: **8** events (Sunnyvale, Milpitas, Alviso, East Foothills, Evergreen)

District 4: **7** events (Santa Clara, Campbell, West San Jose)

District 5: **16** events (Palo Alto, Mtn. View, Los Altos, Los Altos Hills, Saratoga, Cupertino)

These events were held over 29 days between September 9 through November 8. On multiple days we held as many as 4 events on the same date. Outreach was conducted on weekends, on weekdays and evenings.
