- ❖ Over 623 recommendations from 15 sources grouped into 80 Summarized Recommendations
 - Includes action steps taken, Budget Status, Source(s) of the Recommendations, Responsible Department(s), Master Jail Reform List Numbers, Date Reviewed by FGOC and the Board

- ❖ FGOC completed review of Summarized Recommendations on 1/26/17

- ❖ Board received the matrix on May 16, 2016, and FGOC approved the categories on June 9, 2016
- ❖ Board study sessions: June 28, 2016, September 20, 2016, December 20, 2016, May 23, 2017, August 15, 2017, and December 5, 2018
- ❖ FGOC met August 26, 2016, September 7, 2016, September 30, 2016, November 10, 2016, and December 19, 2016, January 26, 2017, March 23, 2017, March 29, 2017, April 20, 2017, October 5, 2017, October 24, 2017, November 20, 2017, and December 14, 2017
- ❖ Tracking mechanism implemented to ensure timely responses to Board and FGOC referrals
- ❖ Continuing multi-department stakeholder meetings at all levels of the organization

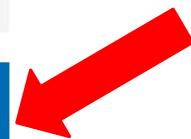

Jail Reform Funding and Actions Approved Since Last Study Session on 12/5/17

- ❖ Approved pre-qualification package for Correctional Facilities Improvement projects and authorized advertisement
- ❖ Approved Agreement with CGL Companies, LLC for consulting services for jail organizational structure
- ❖ Authorized extension of extra-help hours beyond the 1,040 hours limitation for 216 per diem and extra-help nurses for SCVMC and Custody Health Services
- ❖ Amended salary ordinance and added the classification of Director, Custody Behavioral Health Services
- ❖ Transferred funds for Elmwood and Main Jail Suicide Prevention Barriers project



Jail Reform Funding and Actions Approved Since Last Study Session on 12/5/17(cont.)

- ❖ Approved recommendations relating to the Community Recidivism Reduction Grant Program to support adult reentry services
- ❖ Approved recommendations relating to the New Jail Replacement Facility
- ❖ Approved actions to establish an Office of Correction and Law Enforcement Monitoring
- ❖ Approved budgetary augmentation to support Custody Health Services as part of the FY 2017-2018 Mid-Year Budget Review
- ❖ Approved Amendment with SJSU Research Foundation for in-custody education services

Status Update

- Implemented 2-Tier medical, mental health, and suicide risk assessment screening at Intake Booking.
- Decreased Wait Time at Intake Booking.
- Number of Behavioral Health Teams Increased from 9 to 10.
- Custody Health will continue to monitor and assess all activities to adapt to the evolving needs of inmates
- Custody Health continues to work with the Sheriff's Office in the implementation of the Jail Management System, and with Facilities and Fleet to complete construction projects.

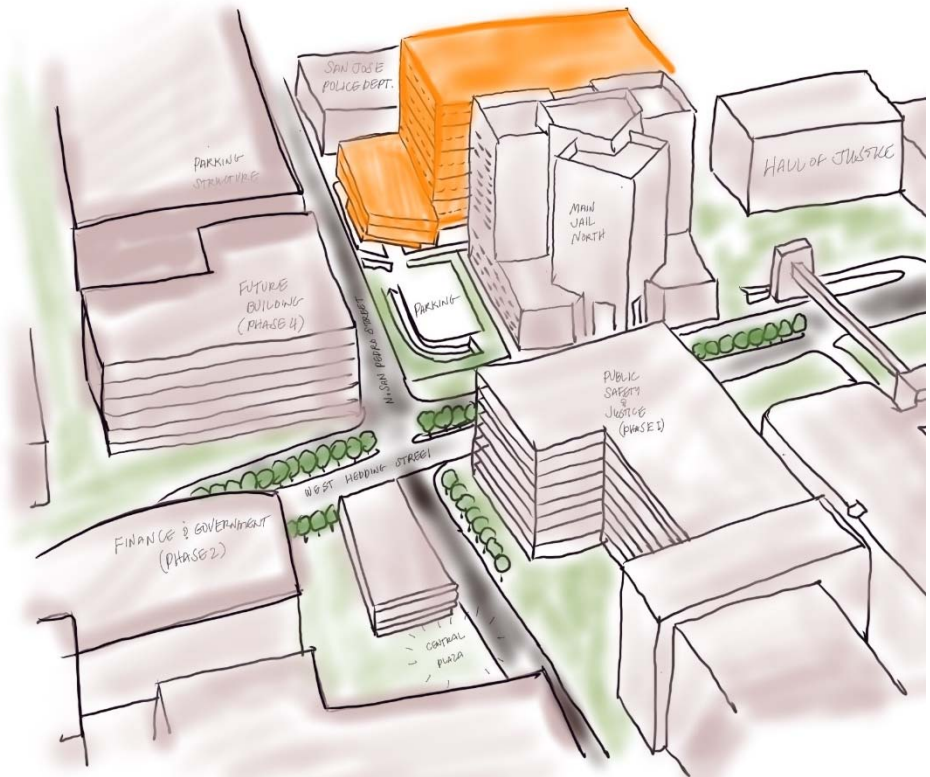

Status of Projects

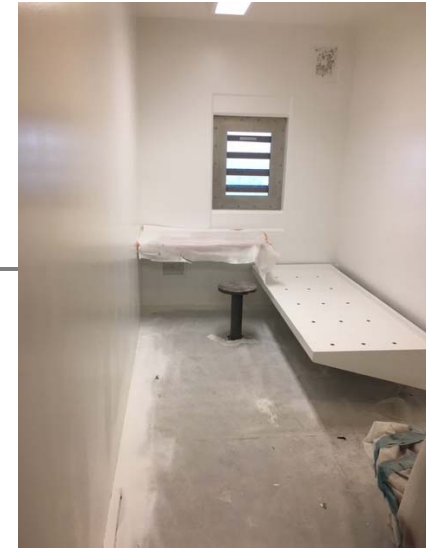
➤ New Main Jail South

- Bridging Documents in development to incorporate reduced facility size
- State BSCC approved scope changes Feb 8, 2018
- Updated Designs to Board by late Spring/early Summer 2018



Status of Projects (cont.)

- Main Jail 4th and 5th Floor Hardening
 - Construction is 40% complete and incorporates pleasing colors and suicide barriers
- Elmwood M1 Sundeck and 2nd floor Renovation
 - Construction was completed on Oct 1, 2017. Await completion of BSCC scope changes end of March 2018.



Status of Projects (cont.)

➤ Surveillance Cameras at Jails

- Construction started April 2017 and is 95% complete and scheduled to complete Spring 2018. Project incorporates fence alarm.

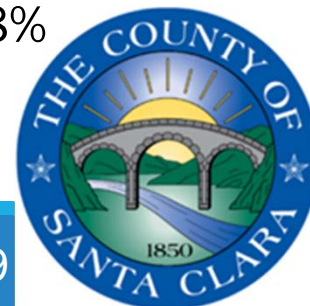
➤ Suicide Prevention

- Permanent design solutions are 100% complete and construction contract awarded Oct 18, 2017.
- Permanent systems are installed in 2 housing units at Elmwood
- Housing unit at Main Jail North scheduled to complete March 2018, and remainder of suicide prevention barriers should be complete by end of 2018.
- Designs for Suicide Cell Prevention Cell features are 100% complete but will be repackaged with ADA efforts to minimize moving inmates twice for construction.



Status of Projects (cont.)

- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) work
 - Main Jail North Quick Fixes are 100% complete
 - Elmwood Quick Fixes construction is 25% complete
- MJN and Elmwood Correctional Health Administration
 - Working with CHS on temporary furniture
 - Initiating design process for permanent administrative area renovations for additional staff
- Recent FAF Project Actions
 - Design process to harden Elmwood West Gate has started and anticipate Design complete Summer 2018.
 - Elmwood Minimum Camp Barracks 3: ADA construction is 98% complete and will complete prior to summer 2018
 - Elmwood ADA Path of Travel Design are in design.
